Collocation refers to words that are found together in language. Collocations can be fixed, where it is difficult to replace one of the words with an alternative, or freer, allowing for more choice of words. Example, 'Utter disaster' is a fixed collocation, as there are few words that can be used instead of 'disaster'.
